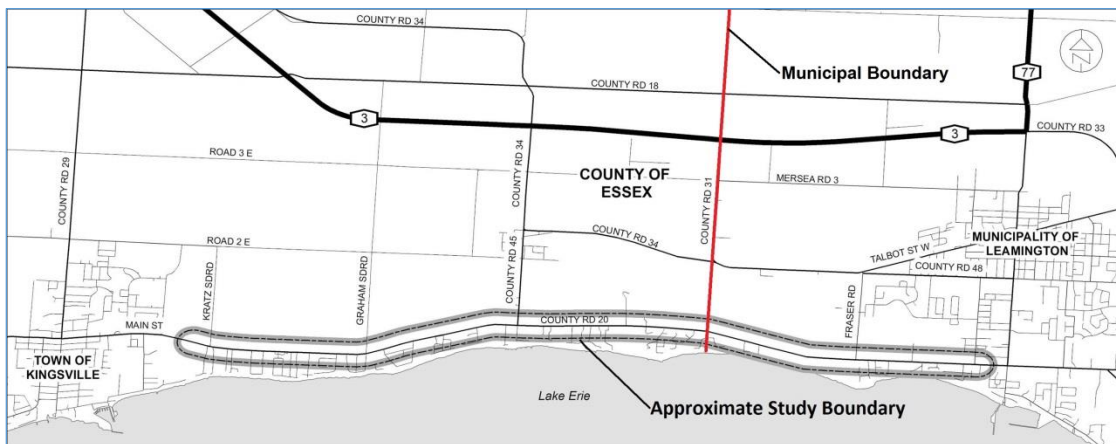


## Notice of Completion of Class Environmental Assessment and Preliminary Design, Class Environmental Assessment and Preliminary Design, County Road 20

The Corporation of the County of Essex (the County) has completed Schedule “C” Environmental Assessment (EA) and Preliminary Design Study under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process (Class EA), for County Road 20 (CR 20), from Kratz Sideroad in the Town of Kingsville to Sherk Street in the Municipality of Leamington. The completed Class EA study includes previous project notices and invitations to participate in public events.

Modifications to the County Road 20 corridor are needed to address traffic control issues and pedestrian and cyclist safety. The improved transportation corridor will serve the needs of the transportation system and promote growth for a 20-year period to 2035. Key recommended components of the project include: intersection improvements, provision of a 2-way centre turning lane at two locations, and new multi-use pathway and sidewalk. The project is to be constructed in phases with the initial phase being completed within 5 years.



The Environmental Study Report (ESR), which outlines the recommended project in more detail, is available for review for 30 days (until December 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018.) The ESR is available on-line at [www.CR20.ca](http://www.CR20.ca) and or can be viewed at the Leamington and Kingsville municipal offices.

Comments on the ESR are to be directed to the County contact as noted below. If you would like to voice your concerns after consulting with the County of Essex's staff, you have the right to request the Minister of Environment, Conservation and Parks, to make a Part II Order (11th Floor, 77 Wellesley St. W., Toronto, Ontario, M7A 2T5). A Part II order may result in the need for an individual EA. A copy of the Part II request should also be forwarded to Essex County. If there aren't any outstanding concerns after December 7<sup>th</sup> 2018, the project will be considered to have met the requirements of the Class EA.
